<sup>9</sup>And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, <sup>10</sup>so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God. <sup>11</sup>May you be strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy . . . COLOSSIANS 1:9-11

The Apostle Paul wrote this letter to the church in Colossae, who had heard the gospel through the ministry of Epaphras. At that time, the church was facing dangerous false teachings and they needed to safeguard and follow what they had already been taught about Jesus. They had to learn to walk out their faith and not fall into heresy. In this passage, Paul shares his prayer for them, that they may have wisdom and knowledge from God, that they may bear fruit in Him, and that they may have divine power to be strong and endure. In this lesson, we will look at his prayer and how this can be applied to our lives.

# 1 Wisdom

And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding . . . COLOSSIANS 1:9

At a time when they were tempted to add good works and rituals to Christ's finished and complete work on the cross, Paul prayed that the church would have the knowledge and wisdom that can only come from God. This would keep them from following any false gospel or false teaching. Why do you think Paul prayed for them to be *filled* with the knowledge of God's will? Why can't we just pray to have a little bit or just enough? Why does God want us to be *filled*?

### 3 Power

<sup>11</sup>May you be strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy, <sup>12</sup>giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. **COLOSSIANS 1:11,12**

- How can you know God and His Word more every day? Share one practical thing you will do to know Him more.

#### **PRAYER**

- Thank God for who He is, what He has done for you, and how He reveals Himself to you through His Word.
- Pray Colossians 1:9-12 over your life and for those in your Victory group.
- Pray that you would never attempt to add anything to Christ's finished and complete work on the cross.
