APPLICATION

- Have you surrendered to the Lordship of Jesus Christ?
 If not, would you like to surrender your life completely to Him today?
- Which areas of your life do you still need to submit to Christ's Lordship? How can your thoughts, words, and actions reflect Jesus' Lordship over you this week?
- Do you have beliefs, thought patterns, or practices that you know are not in agreement with God's Word? How can you renew your mind and know Him more every day?

PRAYER

- Surrender every area of your life to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. Declare your trust in God's character, sovereignty, and faithfulness, and your allegiance to Him. Pray that your life would always and only be about Jesus, period.
- Ask God to help you live out your decision to serve and live for Him completely and wholeheartedly.
- Pray for those you know who have not yet surrendered their lives to Jesus Christ. Trust that the Lord will use you to draw them closer to Him and your life will be an example to many.

WARM-UP

"Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ." ACTS 2:36

That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ROMANS 10:9

To believe in Jesus means to accept Him as both Savior and Lord. If we say, "Jesus is Lord," that means He is our master and He calls the shots. This declaration is more than intellectual assent or lip service. It means we wholeheartedly submit our lives to Him and His Word. Jesus is either Lord of all or not at all. He can't be Lord of some or most of our lives—He has to be Lord of every area, every day. In this lesson, we will look at three areas that we wrestle with, which should be under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

1 Jesus is Lord of my will.

"Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done." LUKE 22:42

If locus is Lord, that means we submit our will to His

purposes. Even Jesus surrendered to the will of His Father.
Like Jesus, we need to make a decision to follow God
and walk out this decision, no matter how hard it gets.
How can following our own will, emotions, and ideas be

2 Jesus is Lord of my mind.

We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ. 2 CORINTHIANS 10:5

Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. ROMANS 12:2

Making Jesus Lord of your mind is about filling your mind
with His Word. Our thoughts should be obedient to Christ,
and we should not allow ungodly thoughts to rule our minds
How has reading the Bible transformed the way you think
and act? How has God's Word helped you know His will?

3 Jesus is Lord of my body.

Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own . . . 1 CORINTHIANS 6:19

To make Jesus Lord is to acknowledge that our bodies are no longer our own. What we believe should reflect in how we live, including where we go, what we do, and what we say. What is a *temple*? The Bible says that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit. How has this affected your lifestyle? What does it mean to make Jesus the Lord of your body?
