Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful. JAMES 5:11

The Apostle James commended Job's steadfastness in enduring suffering. God eventually restored what was lost and stolen from Job, but what was more notable was Job's response during his time of suffering. How can we learn to be steadfast in trials? Here are three truths that can help you be strong and steadfast in trying times.

1 God's purposes will prevail.

"I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted." JOB 42:2

We must understand that God is not the source of our suffering. He may allow suffering to happen, but His purposes will prevail above all. No matter what the situation, no one can ever say that His plans and purposes are wrong, because they are always enduring and worth trusting (Proverbs 19:21). How have you witnessed God's purposes prevail in your own life?

2 God's ways are higher than ours. "'Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?' Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know." JOB 42:3 Job recognized that God's knowledge was far too great for him to grasp. Isaiah 55:8 also states that God's thoughts and ways are not like ours. We do not know or

3 God is greater than we perceive.

⁵"I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; ⁶therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes." JOB 42:5,6

Job saw how small he was after encountering God's glory and presence. The truth is, God is bigger and more vast than anything we can ever comprehend. Our current understanding of God is and will always be too small compared to who He is in reality. When we pursue God in the midst of our suffering, we encounter the greatness of God and see Him for who He is. Share one thing you learned about God during a trying time.
