Facing difficult situations with faith takes a lot of courage and strength. But as we trust God and His promises, we will see that He can work in our midst and turn things around. Today, we will look at how Jochebed, Moses's mother, put her faith and full confidence in the Lord—and how God, in turn, honored her faith with blessing and providence.

1 | In the midst of difficulty, we can act on our faith and be courageous.

*²The woman conceived and bore a son, and when she saw that he was a fine child, she hid him three months. ³When she could hide him no longer, she took for him a basket made of bulrushes and daubed it with bitumen and pitch. She put the child in it and placed it among the reeds by the river bank. **EXODUS 2:2,3***

At the time Moses was born, there was an order to throw every male Hebrew child into the Nile because the Pharaoh of Egypt dreaded the Hebrews (Exodus 1:22). But instead of allowing fear to overcome her, Jochebed mustered up the courage to protect Moses. Knowing that they were God's chosen people, she trusted the Lord fully and exercised her faith. As she held on to her faith, she had quiet confidence that Moses was an extraordinary child and God would protect and use him for His purpose (Acts 7:20). Like Jochebed, have you ever found yourself in an impossible situation? How did your faith in God help you overcome fear and face the difficulty with courage?

2 | When we put our hope in God, He will work in our midst and reward our faith.

*⁵Now the daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her young women walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her servant woman, and she took it. ⁶When she opened it, she saw the child, and behold, the baby was crying. She took pity on him and said, "This is one of the Hebrews' children." **EXODUS 2:5,6***

Moses was born at a time of extreme hardship (Exodus 1:10–14). But even though the Pharaoh sought to destroy the Hebrew people at that time, along with their newborn sons, God had a different plan. Jochebed’s act of faith and courage was rewarded by God with blessing and providence. He used the Pharaoh’s very own daughter to rescue Moses. Though aware that he was a Hebrew child, the Pharaoh’s daughter was moved with compassion and even sought Jochebed’s help in nursing her own son (Exodus 2:9). Not only was Moses spared from death, he was also reunited with Jochebed—a clear example of how God works in our midst when we put our hope in Him. How has God worked in your life and honored your faith? What does Ephesians 3:20 say about how He answers our prayers?
