APPLICATION

WORD

¹Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. ²This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." ³Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." JOHN 3:1-3

(Read also **JOHN 3:4-21.**)

Nicodemus was a Pharisee, a prominent religious figure of high stature and teacher among the people. He was considered righteous by those around him. But one night, he visited Jesus in secret and sought His teaching. Nicodemus learned that he needed something from Jesus—something that transformed and renewed him. This was being born again in the spirit. Today, let's look at what we can learn from Nicodemus's encounter with Jesus.

We need to be spiritually reborn to enter the kingdom of God.

³Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." . . . ⁵Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God." **JOHN 3:3, 5**

This is the Scripture where we get the term "born again."
We are all born once from our mothers' wombs, but to
enter God's kingdom, we need to be born of the Spirit. This
is because we were all spiritually dead in sin (Ephesians
2:1–3) and will eventually lead to eternal death in hell unless
we experience spiritual rebirth. The kingdom of heaven is
spiritual in nature and only those who are spiritually alive
can enter.

2 We need to believe in Jesus to have eternal life.

¹⁴"And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life." **JOHN 3:14-15**

While talking to Nicodemus, Jesus foretold His own death. Like the bronze snake of Moses (Numbers 21:9), Jesus said, the Son of Man must be lifted up on a pole, and whoever looks to Him will be saved. This directly foreshadowed Jesus being lifted on the cross, and until today, whoever looks to

the transforming work of God is evident in the lives of those who come to the light of Jesus, put their faith in Him, and experience spiritual rebirth. John 3:8 likens one born of the spirit to wind—although it cannot be seen, its presence can be felt. So it was with Nicodemus. He eventually moved from larkness (secret meetings at night) to light. Though we don't now exactly when he put his faith in Christ, he began to peak publicly in favor of Jesus—no more hiding. At a time when Jesus was attracting the wrong sort of attention from the authorities, Nicodemus took His side, risking revealing timself as a follower of Christ (John 7:45–52). His encounter with Jesus had caused this transformation. What are some isible changes in your life, when you experienced the new birth?

Him in faith is saved. The one who believes in lesus has been
